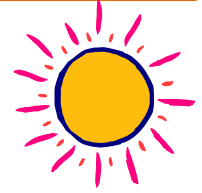

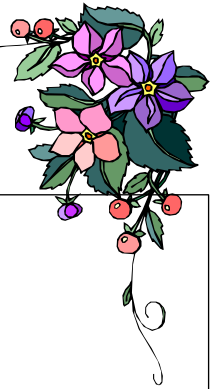

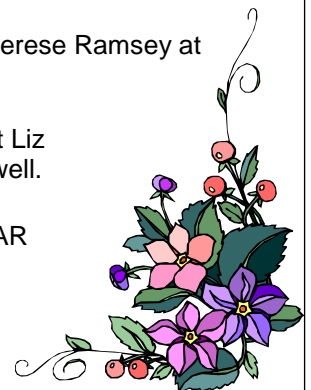

Nora Krein - Announced the upcoming programs and workshops:

August 28th Program:

Lola Jenkins-her program is titled "Miss Bubble Buster"

Workshop on August 29th – Fantasy Collage the cost for this is \$40 members and \$45 non-members (there will also be a kit but it is optional and the cost for it is \$30, this will be in addition to the workshop fee).

September 25th Program:

Linda Everheart-her program is titled "Don't sweat the details"

***Workshop on September 26th** – Reverse appliqué, enchanted emerald Isle

October 23^d Program:

Jim Gatling-his program is titled "Today's quilts from yesterday's designs"

***Workshop on October 24th** - Insanity Quilt

Tonight's Program - Nora introduced tonight's speaker:

Alice McElwain is a teacher, a speaker with over 30 years experience, and a certified appraiser with AQS. She is here to talk about Edie Idlemen's life and show just a small portion of her quilts.

Alice will be the appraiser at our upcoming 2015 quilt show. She says there are 4 types of appraisals for:

- 1) Insurance
- 2) Fair Market Value
- 3) Donations
- 4) Estate Sales

She mentioned that in this day contemporary quilts are worth more than antiques. You need to get your quilts reappraised every 3 years because fads drive up the prices.

If you are interested in getting your quilt or quilts appraised at the Quilt Show then get in touch with Lori Jones to sign up.

Alice met Edie when Edie moved from Cherryville, Kansas to Arkansas and started going to the Rabbits Lair in Rogers. Edie mentored Alice and it was after Edie passed away in 2009 that she began working towards her certificate.

Edie was an American Quilter's Society certified appraiser and an accomplished quilter herself. She made and collected Princess Feather Quilts and had over 100 in her collection. In the 1950's – 1885 the most popular color in the home was red/white/green. Many think this pattern was inspired by the Amaranth plant, also known as Princes' Feather, Princess Feather, Kiss Me over the Fence, Love Lies Bleeding and Prince of Wales' Feather. The first published quilt pattern was said to be in 1835 by Godley. Dates on the Princess Feather Quilts were from the early 1800's – 1880's. Most of the green dye and red dye in the quilts have faded over time. Many beautiful quilts of all sizes was showed and admired.
