The technique is paper piecing, experience not required. Start signing up with Suzanne Kittrell \$35 (or \$25 for MQG members), space is limited. The workshop will be held at the Rogers Activity Center at 315 West Olive Street in Rogers from 9am-1pm. We have the room till 3pm so you can stay a bit longer if needed.

### Supplies Needed:

Book, New York Beauties & Flying Geese: 10 Dramatic Quilts, 27 Pillows, 31 Block Patterns

Purchase the book in advance to allow for fabric requirements and cutting preparations. You will want to make copies of the appropriate paper-piecing and solid area templates for the Fox Hole

Pillow or purchase acrylic templates for solid areas (see below for more infomation). If unable to purchase the book beforehand, foundation papers for the Flying geese and pieced arcs will be available for \$12. A fabric and template supply list can be provided if needed.



You can get the book online or maybe your local quilt store. The book is \$19 on Amazon. A member spotted Carl's book at the Fayetteville Joann's (you can use your coupon!).

Elizabeth Ray has both sets of the thick acrylic templates that go with the book, you are welcome to borrow and trace onto your fabric at the workshop. These can also be purchased at quiltexchange.com, search for Background & Circles.





Quilt Congress 2017

We are just over 2 months away from Quilt Congress (October 27-28)!

I keep getting asked, "What is Quilt Congress?" The term "Congress" is used because it is a gathering of guilters from the northwest quadrant of the state of Arkansas, although it is not limited to that area. This has been going on since the 1980's to bring quilters together to hear speakers, have workshops, shop vendors, find bargains at the country store and silent auction, compete in a challenge, see some show and tell, have a meal together, and make new friends. We don't vote on anything and there is very little business taken care of at all! It is a couple of days to concentrate on all things quilty! The \$35 charge is a bargain for all of this! Our workshops are only an additional \$25 plus the reasonable price of kits. I hope all of you sign up! There will be a limit of 300 spots, so sign up soon. The deadline is October 5.

Our next Congress meeting is Monday,October 21 at 5:30 at First Methodist Church in Springdale. I have sent out all the registration forms in emails to most of you. I will bring a few paper forms for those of you without computers at the upcoming meeting. Forms and information are also available on our edublog, quiltguildnwa.edublogs.org and on quiltcongress.blogspot.com.

We will be making up some volunteer sign-ups soon for the Congress. We will need help in the Country Store and Silent Auction, the registration table, breakout sessions, lunch distribution and other areas. You do not get free admission if you help, just my undying affection.

- 1 Jelly Roll\*
- 2 Fat Eighths (tan in example)
- 1 ¼ yds, inner border (tan print)
- 2 ½ yds, outer border (navy print)
- \*Substitute 30 assorted Fat Quarters for Layer Cake & Jelly Roll

#### Runner

- 1 yd, background & border (tan print)
- 5/8 yd, wedges & binding (purple tone-on-tone)
- 1/3 yd, blocks & wedges (purple floral)
- 1/4 yd, wedges & applique (green)



Cotton Thread to compliment fabric choices

#### **TOOLS**

Sewing Machine & Extension Cord Rotary Cutter - regular and pinking blade

**Cutting Mat** 

Rulers: 3" to 4" x 12" long & 6: to 8" square

Iron and Ironing Board Normal Sewing Supplies

Freezer paper - wedge template (optional), available in kit or separately for \$9

Glue Stick

Spray sizing (not starch), if desired






























# **GUILD MEETING MINUTES**
