Ways and Means will not be at the meeting so hang onto those donations until next month.

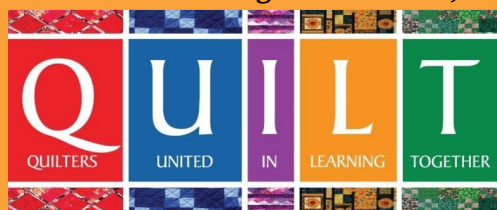

**Thank you** to those who have turned quilts in so far. The last day to turn quilts in for this auction is at the March meeting so there still is time to make a small quilt.

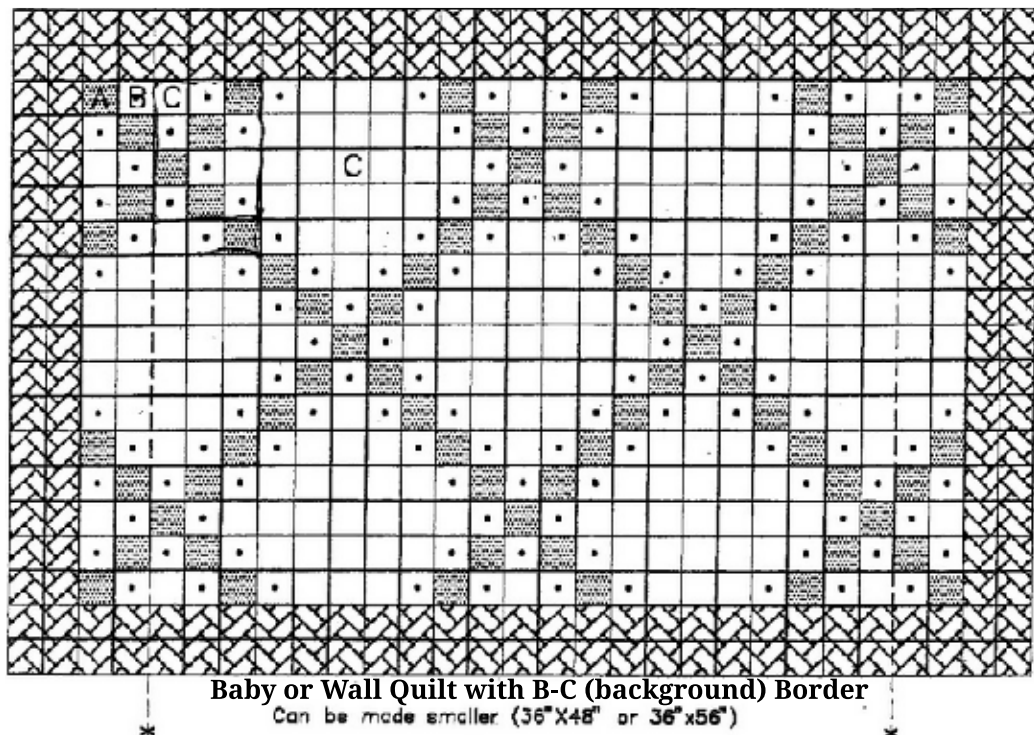

Here are some very important dates!!! **Your quilts must be pre-registered for entry NO LATER THAN Friday, March 6th, 2015!** This includes completing the online registration form and having the photos and fees postmarked by that date. Remember, late entries will NOT be accepted!!! **Quilts must be delivered to a designated drop-off location NO LATER THAN 5:00 p.m. March 20, 2015.** There are SEVERAL drop-off locations. I'm sure there is one near you! Late entries will NOT be accepted!!!

In January, we had a couple people come to the NTI Student Center in Springdale to get their quilts registered. I want to thank Sheila Bayles for helping with the computer and Judy Van Der Ham for taking the pictures.

We will be available again to help with registering your quilts on February 14, 2015 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the NTI Student Center in Springdale. (Though this will be passed by the time this hits the newsletter!) Sheila Bayles will also be available at guild meetings as will Judy Van Der Ham will be



available to take a picture of your quilt. The picture-taking service is only available for members who have no other way of getting a picture of their quilt.

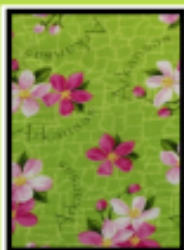

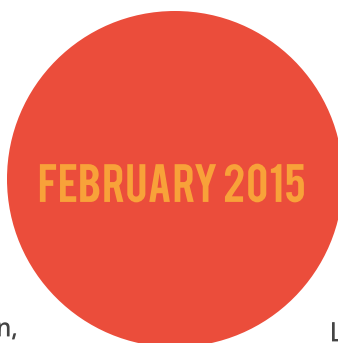
