A message from our President


Dear Hearts!!!!!



Modern quilter Jacquie Gering will be teaching this workshop on the Supernova. Cost will be \$45 for members and \$50 for non-members.

This workshop combines simple sewing with a bit of color work

and improvisation to make the explosive Supernova quilt. The Supernova design takes advantage of the ability of the stitch and flip triangle block to create shape. As you make the quilt, you'll learn about the importance of using value differences to create a design with depth and movement as well as how improvisation can

create variety and unexpected shapes which lead to a dynamic design. The Supernova quilt for this class finishes at 54" x 54".

Supplies needed for this workshop are listed below:

FABRIC

Background (beige*): 2 yds

- Colorway #1 (blues*): ¼ yd (fat qtr) each of 6 coordinating prints or solids in varying values
- Colorway #2 (oranges*): ¼ yd (fat qtr) each of 3 coordinating prints or solids in varying values & ½ yd each of 3 addt'l coordinating prints or solids in varying values

***FABRIC RECOMMENDATIONS:** Beige background, oranges and blues are for example only and are based on the inspiration quilt. Feel free to choose the colors of your quilt based on your preferences. Monochromatic prints (prints that read as a single color) or solids work best in this design. Feel free to combine prints and solids in one quilt. It is important that your colored fabrics contrast with your background fabric.

Basic Sewing/Quilting Supplies Rotary Cutting/Pressing Tools



Cutting Mat Acrylic Ruler Pins Neutral colored sewing thread

OPTIONAL PRECUTTING:

From Background Fabric cut:



Tonight's Program:

Lori Jones introduced Raija Salomaa (The Journey of a Quilt Pattern Designer). Raija provided a PowerPoint presentation of her life and how it all began starting with sewing as a young girl in school to quilting and now pattern designing. Raija is originally from Finland in a community of around 2,500 people. She is the youngest of four children. When she came to the United States she became interested in quilting. She started designing quilts in 2003, but then her husband became ill and she had to put this on hold. In 2013, her brother-in-law passed away and this started her thinking again of her desire to write and design patterns. She joined our guild and then attended the "Airing of the Quilts" that year. She was approached by Debbie Moore concerning the quilt she brought and Debbie ended up being a big help to her as she makes her dream a reality. In 2014, she finally published "Painted Lattice", before the end of the year she had four patterns published. She had previously contacted Timeless Treasures and Hoffman but she found out that she was not quite ready. After getting her patterns published she was ready and contacted Timeless Treasures. They wanted her to calculate yardage for shops, and make a sell sheet. Each of her patterns has three sizes with three different color variations to view. Raija mentioned that designing is just the beginning; you also have to write instructions, use computer programs, take good photos, layout and editing, testing, revising, printing, website development, selling and perseverance. Raija also showed several of her beautiful quilts along with quilts from her "testers". She is planning on designing more patterns, working on renditions with Timeless

Treasures, more marketing, submitting designs to magazines, possible book writing. Along with her long-arm business she is also an Innova Longarm sales rep, wife and mother.


