Though the first barn quilt appeared on the scene in 2001, Parron actually never heard of quilt barns (as they are sometimes called) or quilt trails until 2008. In 2008, she set off on a road trip from Georgia to Wyoming with Yellowstone as the turnaround point. The first evening brought the first barn quilt in Cadiz, Kentucky.
