JANUARY SPEAKER: DORIE HRUSKA

Dorie has written three books, designed quilt patterns, and mastered the art of free motion quilting on a longarm. She spends valuable time considering the best stitch patterns to enhance the design of the quilt, considering contours, and planning a path to keep her needle moving without stopping to move to another area.

One feature that she showcased was her appliqué hexies. In 2006, after discovering a love for Hexagons, she started designing patterns and teaching classes on her method of hand piecing hexagon designs. The hexies on the quilts she showed us were appliquéd on while she quilted the “sandwich,” traveling across the piece from corner to corner.

Her quilt, Flourishing Garden, featuring layered hexagon has won multiple awards including Best Machine quilting at the Ozark Piecemakers 2011 quilt show in Springfield Missouri.

She likes Glide thread: it has sheen, and shows up the designs of her quilting. Two layers of batting work best for her: 80/20, with wool on top.

Dorie’s quilts are beautiful, but I could not properly capture the beauty of her stitching.

FEBRUARY WORKSHOP

English Paper Piecing Class

Sat Feb. 23—10:00-2:00, Sager Creek Quilt Shop, 304 E Central St, Siloam Springs, AR 72761

Supplies you will need to bring:

Scissors—you will be cutting fabric as well as paper so if you like different scissors for these you will want to bring them both.

***Thimble** if you like to use them—this is optional

***In your kit I will provide:**

***Paper Hexagons**

***Fabric**

***Hand Sewing Needle**

***Thread**

You are welcome to bring a sack lunch or snack if you like.

English Paper Piecing (EPP), or Mosaic Patchwork as it is sometimes referred to, is traditionally created by cutting out a series of identical shapes (or a series of shapes that fit together in a geometric pattern) using paper or card to make templates. The paper templates are then wrapped in fabric pieces which are tacked (basted) to secure the fabric to the template. Once a series of paper wrapped and basted shapes are completed, these are sewn together. And once the quilt top (or coaster) is completed, the papers are removed. There are many different shapes sometimes used in EPP but we will be working with a Hexagon.

EPP is a perfect portable project after some basic prep work.

For this class we will be making one block which can be used to make a coaster or pin-cushion or it can be the start of your next big quilt. We will explore several options for making and preparing templates and stitching together one of the most basic EPP shapes—the hexagon.

MOST HAND QUILTERS HAVE A FAVORITE THIMBLE SHE CONSIDERS PART OF THE TOOLS SHE USES TO CREATE HER STITCHES THAT GROW INTO DESIGNS. SOME OF THESE QUILTS ARE ANTIQUES. OTHERS ARE CONTEMPORARY. A FEW OF THE QUILTS ARE TIMESPAN QUILTS MEANING THEY WERE BEGUN BY ONE WOMAN AND FINISHED BY ANOTHER WOMAN LATER.

We are excited about the quilt show to be held on Friday, April 5 and Saturday, April 6. The set-up will begin on Thursday, April 4 and all the information and times are listed on the sign-up sheets as well as the attachment to this newsletter.
