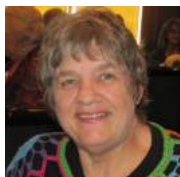

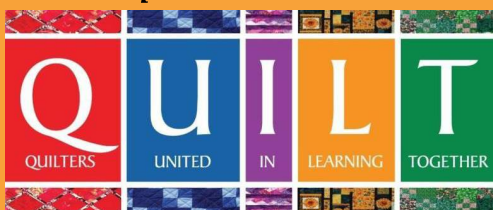

SPEAKER: RAIJA SALOMAA

"The Journey of a Quilt
Pattern Designer"

Raija Salomaa is the owner of Quilters' Treasure Chest, a quilt pattern business located in the city of Rogers. She is a native of the Nordic country of Finland, the land of over a hundred thousand lakes and magnificent textile designs.

Although sewing since childhood, Raija didn't get introduced to quilting until she was in her late twenties. Quilting took over Raija's life very quickly, and before long she was designing her own quilt patterns. Having taught quilting in the years past Raija is very aware of the need for precise, accurate, and easy-to-follow instructions. Hence Raija spent years developing patterns that will deliver much more than your average quilt pattern. From detailed instructions, including pressing directions, to color pictures, Raija has put a lot of thought and effort into developing a pattern format that will impress even the most demanding quilter.

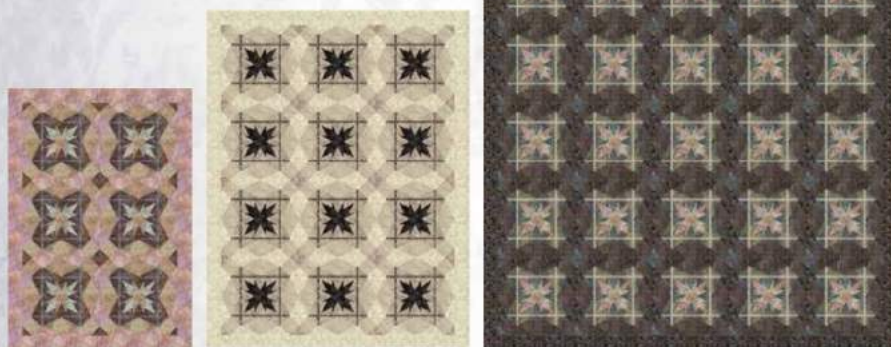

A NOTE FROM BARB HAMERNIK - MEMBERSHIP CHAIR

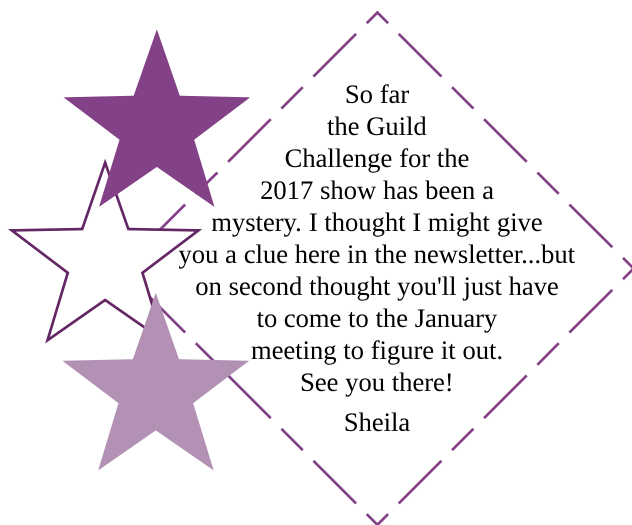

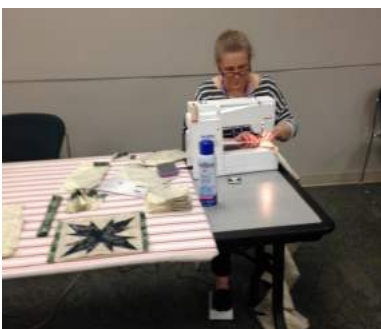

Have trouble remembering all the details of each quilt you've made? Keep a number system!

- 1) **Make a chronological list** of each quilt (spreadsheets are great to do this in a jiffy!). Include dates begun, date finished, size, your inspiration. Number the quilt and give it a name.
- 2) **Get a binder.** Fill it with the making details for each quilt. Sketches or patterns, templates, photos, rough draft of labels, etc. Sheet protectors work great for this step.

That simple chronological list with its number system serves as an index to find all the information you need to know about any past quilt.

Raija Salomaa has sent them to the printer.

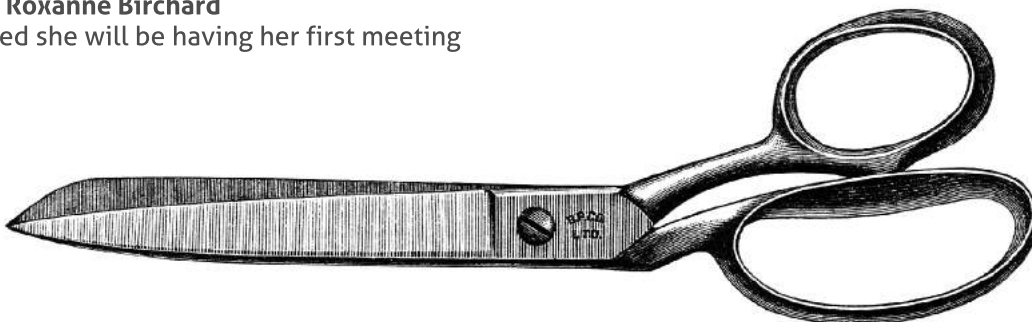
Quilt Congress in 2017

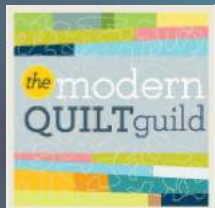
