



Let's Snuggle Up With a Good Book: 2019 Quilt Show Challenge

This is for Q.U.I.L.T. of NW Arkansas's challenge for 2019. The quilt must be at least 30 inches across by 30 inches in length. It can be maximum of 40 inches across by 40 inches in length. It also must be by definition a quilt with 3 layers; top, batting, and backing. Any technique to make the top can be used to convey the topic of the quilt.

The quilt needs to based on a single book. It can be either a summary of the book or a major scene in the book. The title of the book and the author must be on the front of the quilt. The lettering can be done either by applique, stencil, printed, pieced, or any other method that makes it readable and must be at least 3/4 inch in height.

Any quilt entered in this category must meet this criteria or it will be placed in another category. Only one entry per member.

Color Wheel Flash Cards

Hue

Hue is another word for a specific color that is different from other colors. For instance, the difference between a red hue and a green hue. Some hues can be described by two color names, like red-orange or blue-green.

Primary

Primary colors within a color wheel are the three parent or stand-alone colors combined to make all the other colors in the wheel. These colors cannot be mixed or made from any of the other colors in the system.

RGB

The initials of the additive system of light and human color perception Red, Green and Blue. These are the three primary, parent, or stand-alone colors in this system which mix together to make all the other colors in the RGB wheel.

RYB

The initials of the subtractive artist's or traditional color system Red, Yellow and Blue. These are the three primary, parent, or stand-alone colors in this system which mix together to make all the other colors in the RYB wheel.

PAINTING WITH WOOL

TAUGHT BY DANI IVES

Since 2013, Dani Ives has been exploring the needle felting technique of painting with wool. She likes to describe it as using nontraditional materials like wool fiber, linen, felt and a barbed needle to mimic traditional painting and drawing techniques.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 22ND TBD COST: \$40 PLUS \$15 KIT Her goal is to elevate the craft of needle felting and push the boundaries of this fiber art to be more revered as an artistic medium. So, she creates highly detailed pieces that often surprise viewers when they learn the medium is wool. Dani's work consists mostly of animal and botanical pieces, and she draws upon her background in biology and conservation education to help bring her favorite subjects to life.

This workshop location is to be determined and will be held on Thursday, February 22nd, time and location to be announced.
