
## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT:

#### Handsome Hand Quilting: Handmade with Needle & Thread

**Special Exhibit:** Hand quilting offers a unique texture that machine quilting cannot duplicate. Please examine the detail and admire the skills used in all these hand quilted quilts! Some quilters have a profound kinship with the needle and thread which they use to manipulate miles of thread to secure the three layers of a quilt together. Most hand quilters have a favorite thimble she considers part of the tools she uses to create her stitches that grow into designs. Some of these quilts are antiques. Others are contemporary. A few of the quilts are TimeSpan quilts meaning they were begun by one woman and finished by another woman later.


