Tonight's Program: Jenny Doan, Missouri Star Quilters - Quilting Quickly

Jenny shared with the Guild how she first came to be a quilter. 20 years ago she was a costume designer in California. When the family decided to move to the small Missouri town of Hamilton, the kids thought she needed something to do, so she took a 6-week quilting class in a neighboring town. Her son then bought her a long-arm quilting machine and this new interest in guilting was formed. The family found that they couldn't buy all the fabrics in the line they wanted so they concentrated first on pre-cuts like charm packs, layer cakes, and jelly rolls. Jenny said she never wanted to be original, she just wanted easy. She demonstrated many different ways of taking one simple block and transforming it into easy designs that look intricate, and mentioned that consistency in your sewing is better than perfection.

Her son Alan, being very involved with the internet, talked her into making tutorials and putting them on you tube. She has made many tutorials and stated that a new tutorial is produced each week on projects that look difficult but are really simple.

Jenny told the audience we don't stop doing what we love, we can just change the way we do them. She has reached out to people all over the world and what she has found is that what she thought was just sewing is in reality, changing people's lives. She said we, as guilters, are changing people's lives with our craft and the more guilters we get involved. the more the art stays alive.

Once Diane finds out if there is a cost, etc., she will then post dates and places that we are able to take the quilt and volunteers will be needed to sign up for shifts to sell tickets.

Rogers Public Library is hosting the Mini Maker Fair on July 19th, 2014. The board agreed to share a booth with the Modern Quilt Guild, they will pay \$25.00 and we will pay \$75.00 in order to place the Guild's Quilt and sell raffle tickets, we will also show some small quilts that will be at our Quilt Show next year. It was also suggested that this is a great opportunity to sell some of the stock the shop items too.
