
A message from our President

JUNE MEETING



Join us this month as we hear from the co-author of **WHERE POPPIES GROW.** Denniele Bohannon and Janice Britz created The Kansas City Star's block-of-the-month quilt, Remembering Almo, to honor those who served their country. Her great-grandfather, Sgt. First Class Almo Ebenezer O'Kell served as a medic during World War I and he wrote many letters home before peritonitis killed him in 1919 after the removal of his appendix. Nearly a century later, Denniele and Janice spent two years stitching O'Kell's memories into a quilt. Their book was published in September, 2014, as the nation was celebrating the centennial of World War I. O'Kell's letters were filled with memories of his family and his homes in Quincy, Illinois and Hamilton, Missouri; but he never shared any complaints about the circumstances of war. Bohannon used her great-grandfather's handwritten letters as a foundation for the story that is told in the book **WHERE POPPIES GROW**!

Supplies needed for this workshop are listed below:

FABRIC

Contrasting fabric

Qty depends on your project: The bigger the block the more fabric you will need. Going to teach 3 ½", 7", 10 ½", or 14" block size.



TOOLS

Quilt in a Day Square up Ruler either 6 ½" or 4 ½" size (suggested)

Bias Square Ruler either 8" or 4" size (for small 3 ½" block)

OR

Omnigrid ruler with bias line running from corner to corner (again, for small 3 ½" block)

Sewing Machine

Basic Sewing Supplies (cutting mat, scissors, thread, etc)

NOTE FROM BARB

If you will be doing the 3 ½" block size, please let me know. I have a type of paper (not paper piecing) to do the ½" half squares and do them accurately. I will need to bring enough for those wishing to try this.

Please don't make or cut anything until that Saturday.

Pressing your fabrics ahead of time will help the process.

If you would like to explore the different sizes, that would be great.

The purpose of this class is not only to learn how to do a Bear Paw block, but to make accurate half square triangle blocks. I would like you to explore getting these down. There are many ways of making them and by working on them, you can find the way that works best for you. I will have triangle paper on a roll for some to try if they want to explore that, too.

Let's have some fun and learn what looks like a difficult block, but really isn't.

Tonight's Program: Pam Goggans of Sager Creek Quilts -A Sample of Samplers

Pam began her quilting career about 25 years ago. After she had been quilting about 10 years, Pam and her husband Cliff opened Sager Creek Quilts in Siloam Springs. Pam not only designs packet patterns, Block of the Month (BOM), Shop Hop quilts and Row by Row quilts; she also makes beautiful intricate miniatures and is a professional machine quilter. Tonight's program featured many of those guilts just mentioned. The miniature's she makes are not paper pieced, she uses her own method with freezer paper to achieve the same effect as paper pieced to replica the larger quilts. One of the reasons she loves the sampler quilts is that you have a large variety of blocks to do specialty quilting on, which adds more interest and design to the quilt and makes it more fun too. Remember when planning your quilt; always try to leave some blank spacing for quilting to accentuate the blocks. The next BOM she has planned is from 'The Farmer's Wife' 1930's book and should be just as fun and interesting as what she brought tonight.
