Super Saturday class: "Diagonal Designs" on August 27 at the church in Rogers off New Hope Road from 9-3.

Paula will provide two different block patterns for the class. Each block contains a diagonal split in color or shading to give you lots of creative options. All the options available for putting together a log cabin style quilt are here. Make it scrappy or sophisticated, you will enjoy creating with either these basic blocks.

The focus will be on choosing fabrics and colors for your block, and then arranging and rearranging the blocks on your design wall to create your own special arrangement. Paula will assist you in creating your own design. These blocks can even be used to create spectacular borders.

Supplies: Supply list will be available at our July meeting or via email.



Fabric Options: As always in a class with Paula, bring lots of options for yourself. Pack a tote bag or a suitcase if you do not know exactly what you want to use. The basic block calls for a light (or medium) for one side and a dark for the other side with a zinger for the center. You will not need much fabric to cut those zingers, but it has to have good contrast with the other two fabrics. If you choose to make it scrappy, you will have more of a challenge, but it adds personality to use a variety of fabrics. It will probably take more time to create this version.

NEEDED...

Someone is needed to volunteer to **"decorate" the window display at the Rogers Public Library**. We can set it up February 25th (Saturday) and take down April 10th (Monday). If you are a working girl (or guy), you can take it down April 9th (Sunday.)

What to display? Antique, modern, paper-pieced, traditional and miniature quilts, machine or hand-quilted. Antique thread spools, irons or anything you like.

Who? Maybe two or three people could get together and get creative. We can have a poster displayed with the quilt show information (date, time, place, etc.). Therese Ramsey did it for our last show. Get suggestions or brainstorm with her.

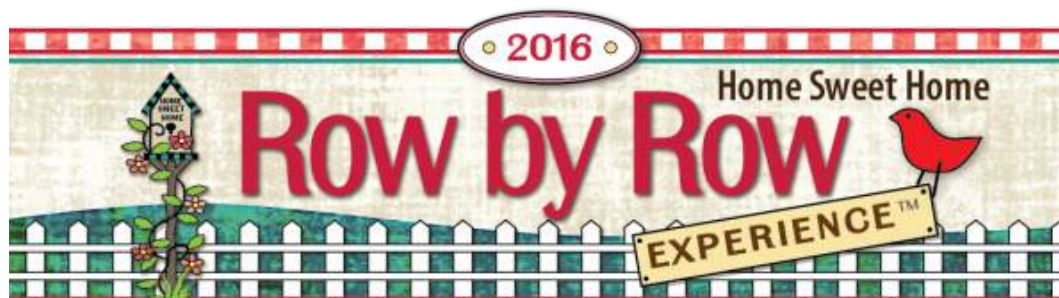

THE TABLE. It is treated practically in the same manner as high grade furniture, being thoroughly sandpapered while the wood is still in the white. It is impossible to procure a good polish on a piece of wood if the surface is not as smooth as it can possibly be made. All of the woodwork which is used on our Model "A" machines is not only sandpapered while in the white, but also after the filler and shellac are applied, so that when the varnishes are put on and rubbed, it gives the outer surface the highly polished finish which is found only on the best grade of furniture. The drawer cases are hand rubbed and finished in oil, while the tops are all highly polished. Our Model "A" work is finished in the popular golden oak, the color in which all high grade furniture is now being finished.

THE GENERAL CONSTRUCTION OF THE DROP HEAD. The lid or top of the drop head, which is hinged to a mirror-like piece, is polished. Read complete description above, explaining how this workwood is finished and polished. This cabinet offers a pretty contrast to the brilliant black enamel of the ribbon stand and the bright colors and nickel parts of the head.

THE COVER. THE COVER WHICH IS USED IN THE MODEL "A" UPRIGHT cover machine, as illustrated above, is a full well rounded cover made from three-ply built up veneered stock, very elaborately carved and decorated, highly polished, nicely finished, and positively the handsomest cover made.

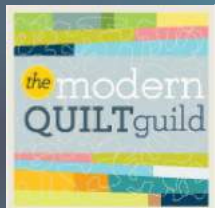
