"My family owns Bittersweet Quilts in Joplin, Missouri. When customers ask me for advice in choosing color combinations, I use the intuitive approach. Let's look at this collection. They all go together, but if you take any one of them away, would you miss it?"

The end of fabric bolts has valuable information for us. It tells the fabric line, the manufacturer, which color to look for, the item number. So if you search for "Over the Rainbow 84181

Andover fabrics Purple," (always enclose the whole thing in quotation marks to narrow the search in the search engine.)

The selvage gives all of the colors in this particular print, so you can match the colors between fabric selections with ease.



These two quilts are exactly alike except for the background. Notice how the colors interact with the black and the white.





There is no shocking contrast to the colors on the left, but the black makes the colors pop in this one on the right.





The elephants and the umbrellas work because there is so much variety. The elephants are made of aboriginal fabric, featuring lots of dots.





Black dye is more stable than it used to be. However black fabric is weaker, since it has to be dipped so many times. "Double Black" means that it has been dyed twice.


Our store is known for a quilt made of homespun pigs & cream background called "Plaid Pigs." Homespun fibers were dyed before they were woven, so they have no front or back. Don't mix glittery fabric with homespun!

So the rehab refers to changing color selection or adding a color that brings out the other colors, giving definition to the design. Some of the quilts not shown could have been enhanced by adding contrast, or sashing, or cornerstones. Mixing whites and cream in the backgrounds keeps the eye moving. Thank you, Robbie!

SUPER SATURDAY SEW IN

Christmas in July



Have a jelly roll you don't know what to do with? Our July Super Saturday Sew In will use a jelly roll to make a Christmas tree quilt.

Called Jingle Pop Trees, this pattern was free last year from Hoffman Fabric. Your teacher is Leeanna Walker, and I made this quilt last year for the annual Altrusa Christmas auction. It sold for \$300, so someone liked it. I'll provide the pattern, you provide everything else.

Here's what you need:

- *Your machine
- *Power strip/extension cord
- *Basic sewing stuff: Rotary mat, ruler, cutter, scissors
- *Template plastic, marker

*1 jelly roll or you can cut your own 2 ½ inch strips. You won't use a full jelly roll (40 strips,) but the more strips you have, the more fun you will have choosing which tree goes where. Cut your strips before class and you'll be cooking with Crisco.

- *1 1/2 yards white/silver fabric for background
- *1 1/8 yards black/silver for outer border and binding
- *1 yard scarlet/silver for inner border

Size: 48 by 64 inches

Be brave! Choose your own color palette. Maybe you want fall trees or spring trees. Let your imagination run.

Note: This pattern uses templates. However, after I had finished, I realized I could have cut them using a ruler with 60 degree marks. They're equilateral triangles. So bring rulers with those marks if you want.
