

Stock the Shop – Nora Krein

Nora's goal was to attract people so they **APRIL 2015** would want to attend again; she accomplished this goal and even had people telling her they are planning on attending earlier at our next quilt show. In 2013, we made about \$1,200 and this year it was almost \$3,800 due to all the beautiful items our members made and donated. Nora presented small gifts to several people that contributed to the Stock the Shop: Dorothy Day, Judy Schoeny, Leeanna Walker, Cassie Robinson, Sheila Bayles, Adele Atha, Kathy Garringer, Therese Ramsey, Diane Stringer, Mary Knapp, Diane Crandell, Rose Lawrence, Sandy Gray, Hazel McFall, Amy Rollins, Margie Langanke, Barbara Hancock, Janet Brown, Susanne Tourtelot, Lila Rostenberg, Paula Mariedaughter, Shirley Herbaugh, Diana Springer, Marty Stanchi and Velina Straw. Diane Crandell also received a "Kiss Me Frog" pattern and Nora presented a special thank you gift to Barbara Hancock for her constant encouragement throughout.

Quilt Show – Diane Crandell

Diane took a few minutes to give her thanks to everyone involved in the set up and take down of the quilts and displays. Many members brought some of their family members, cousins, and friends, to help get this all going. She also named and congratulated each member on her quilt show committee and expressed gratitude to each of them for their hard work and diligence in getting the job done. It was a great show and she was thankful she had a great committee to work with.

Quilt Show Numbers – Barb Hamernik

Barb gave the following information to the guild:

Stock the Shop: made \$3,522 because we had to pay sales tax

Admissions: made \$6,522 after taxes and we had 811 people attend in 2013 and 1,046 attend in 2015. As far as she could calculate taking into consideration the \$1 off coupons and hand stamps from the Antique show Small Quilt Auction: \$3,066 was made

Registration of Quilts: we made \$998 and the Judge cost \$1,170 so we almost made enough to pay for this

Vendors: we made \$310 more than the cost of the building rental

Raffle Quilt: we netted \$3,744 after expenses
Basket Raffle: we made \$247 but had to get a license
which was \$100 for the year. This may not be something
we have at the next quilt show

Quilt Show: we made \$11,475 (not including raffle money) and still have a couple outstanding expenses to account for. We should have the final total at the Board meeting in May

Tonight's Program – Lila Rostenberg

Nora Krein introduced our speaker and guild member Lila Rostenberg. Lila mentioned that she was an art major before she found weaving and then the art of quilting. Lila said she probably began the craft around the bi-centennial time. She

brought many beautiful quilts to show the guild in her trunk show and discussed the colors and designs of each one. In 1981, one of her smaller quilts was featured in Quilt magazine. She taught quilting at the Stitchin' Post in Little Rock then moved to Fayetteville in 1993. When she arrived she opened the quilt shop "Quilt your Heart Out" and sold the business in 2003. She is in her happy place when she is designing and sewing her quilts. Lila is not a perfectionist and always says it will "quilt out". She ended her program by saying whatever you do, "make yourself happy with your quilting".

May 28th - Airing of the Quilts - Nora Krein

Don't forget this meeting will take place outdoors at Loneta Blevin's home located on the corner of Perry Road and Bellview Road, across from Target in Rogers. This is an opportunity for members to enjoy a potluck dinner, bring your quilts whether they are old, new, big or small and hang them on Loneta's wooden fence (don't forget to bring a sheet to put under them) then after the dinner each member has a chance to talk about the quilts they brought. Each member needs to bring a potluck dish, lawn chairs and a table if you wish. Drinks, plates and utensils are provided by the Guild Board.

Quilt Guild Board Meeting Wendy's, Springdale, AR May 4th, 2015

President Kathy Garringer called the meeting to order at 6:04 p.m. Those present were: Kathy Garringer, Betty McKee, Janice Berry, Barbara Hamernik, Cassie Robinson, David Moran, and Rose Lawrence.

Treasurers Report:

Barbara Hamernik presented the financial report and budget. Barbara produced the final quilt show tallies. After all receipts were in the net profit for the quilt show was \$11.297.83.

The Financial Report shows the Guild has \$35,148.06 in the three accounts (Raffle Account, Money Market

Account, and Checking Account). The board had previously discussed the possibility of moving some of this money into our existing money market after the quilt

show. The board elected to move \$10,000 to the Guild's existing money market, this was

approved by all. The board also approved the financial report and current budget as presented.

Quilt Quips Newsletter:

Cassie Robinson asked the board if it was possible to move the minutes and treasurers report to the June issue of the Quilt Quips.

The Board stated that since the May meeting is the "Airing of Quilts" and that we would not be voting on anything they approved her request. The

Cassie uses a new program for the newsletter and she is almost at max data space. She asked the board for an increase of \$100 in her budget, this would allow for increased data space and will finish her out for the remainder of the year.
