Do you have new




projects in mind for the spring or will it be time to finish a project that's been neglected for a while? I have a few of those and several new ones to start.

When the representative came to pick up what they could not use, the person in charge was absent, and some of our quilts were taken by mistake. The following letter explains the situation.

CUDDLY QUILTS

Dear Members.

I just want to follow up on last Thursday night's meeting and emphasize that this was an unfortunate—but innocent—mistake by the Children's Hospital. I may not have made that clear, and I know it's also difficult to hear when we're shocked and angry.

After the meeting one of our members told me she volunteers at the hospital and had arrived right after Donna and I left. She said the volunteer coordinator, the social workers, and the other staff who had heard about this were all devastated that it had happened. They had no idea, and they were not taking it lightly.

She also said the social worker in charge of the quilts had been out sick for three days when the bag of intended donations of unusable items was removed from the closet. The custodian was not aware that only one bag was to be picked up, so he just cleared the closet of all of the quilts. Our contact

member emphasized to me that the quilts are handed out, that the staff love distributing them, and that the children love receiving them. Our work certainly does not go unappreciated at Children's. The hospital gives quilts to other nonprofits only when they're smoke filled, dirty, torn, old, or too tiny even to cover newborns. Our quilts do not fit any of these categories. They do NOT evaluate our quilts in any other way.

Donna, Carrie, and I will meet with the hospital reps, as we said. We will also check on various other venues in the area. There are many people in need. In addition, we will meet with our board members to consult and keep them updated and to have them a part of the decision-making process.

I'm writing this because I hope we as a group will return to the joy of making these quilts of comfort for children who need comforted, wherever they may be, and move past this bump in the road. Helping
