

Quilting Fun Fact

Have you ever heard the story that quilts were used along the Underground Railroad as signals to escaping slaves who were traveling from the South to the North towards freedom? Unfortunately, this story doesn't seem to have any foundation in fact. However, the durability of this myth attests to its appeal.

This doesn't mean that quilters didn't contribute to the Civil War effort. Northern women donated quilts and other crafts to raise money for the Union to buy supplies. In addition, women quilted bedding for Union soldiers. Southern women did much the same for the Confederates by making quilts such as the "Gunboat Quilts" to raise money for their Navy. However, it became increasingly difficult for Southern ladies to make quilts, whether to raise money or for their soldiers to keep warm, due to material shortages as the Civil War progressed.

Carolyn Gaskill introduced tonight's speaker:

Joan Gould, local lecturer and Quilt Historian on Arkansas Quilts.

Joan was born in Iowa but has been an Arkansan for many years. She said all her experience began with her family and the generations of quilt making that had taken place. She told stories that dated back 200 years about the art and expression that is given to quilts. She is not a quilter herself, but she sews. Many of her quilts she presented to the Guild also dated back as far as 200 years. As a preservationist, she has things set out though her log home depicting this era. Joan also explained the steps in the production of linen from fiber to fabric. She also brought a few tools that were used to make the final piece of fabric. She talked about her part in the research of the two log cabins in Randolph County, the items found in those homes, and the farm family who had settled there in the 1800's.
