



Small Quilt Auction



First I want to thank everyone who worked with me setting up, during, and after the auction. I had a fun and hard working crew, and I appreciate each one of you. Also a big thank you to everyone who contributed a quilt (or more!) for the auction. We had an outstanding variety of beautiful quilts and items!

The auction made \$4,287.89 in sales before sales tax was removed, with total proceeds being \$3,905.56. Lila Rostenberg contributed 9 quilts, for a \$385 total, the highest amount a member brought in, followed by Elizabeth Ray's \$355 for her 7 items. Barbara Hancock made \$275 for the guild with her 2 gorgeous quilts. Therese Ramsey was next with \$255, and the Material Girls 4 Cake Slice quilts made \$235. A few other notable recognitions include April Wells at \$175, Kay Jump's quilt, \$170, Laura Speer, \$165, and Liz Ewing, \$160. Four other members brought in \$100 or more, namely Judy Vanderham, Kathy Turner, LoVina Payton and Karen Harmony.

Congratulations to every single person who helped to make this auction a success, whether you donated one quilt or worked quietly behind the scene (Adele Atha!)

Thank you, and this auction is a wrap!

There were approximately 160 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honorable Mention ribbons awarded at the Quilt Show. You may not know this, but the ribbons are ordered from a ribbon supply company, and then they are dismantled in order that we can add our own personal touch with the two color-coordinated fabric rosettes on each ribbon. Then they are put back together. We think this has made our handmade quilt show ribbons that much more special and that winners will continue to enjoy them for years to come! Diane Haseman headed up these ribbons for many years prior to the 2017 show and guided us through the process. Another dozen or more guild members volunteered to make rosettes one weekend and re-assemble at a later date. It took lots of teamwork! Special thanks to all those members! Fabric for the ribbons was donated by Sager Creek, as well as, Suzanne Kittrell, Sue Goldman, and Adele Atha, who served as 1st, 2nd, 3rd, & Honorable Mention Ribbon Co-Chairs.

Once again Sharon Phillips designed and constructed the three Specialty Ribbons including “Best of Show”, “Judge’s Choice”, and “Viewer’s Choice”. As always, these ribbons were spectacular!

Jeanette Strickert designed and made ribbons for ALL who entered Children’s Quilts in the show again this year. Each ribbon was unique with a paper-pieced sewing machine in the center of each ribbon.

Publicity and advertising for the Quilt Show included many various activities, such as:


- Two newspaper articles and pictures ran in the Arkansas Democrat Gazette; one on March 11th and a much larger article in the Our Town section of the paper on April 6th just before the show. The last article included color pictures of our Best of Show and Judge’s Choice winners and their quilts.
- 7,000 Bookmarks and color flyers left with quilt shops in Northwest Arkansas and mailed to another 50 quilt shops in Arkansas, Oklahoma, & Missouri. Thirty emails sent to shops in Missouri, Oklahoma & Arkansas and to 14 Quilt Guilds in Arkansas.
- Color Flyers made available to guild members and sent to quilt shops
- Guild participated in Geek Days at the Rogers Public Library and brought along Quilt Show information with them. Two display windows were prepared at the Bentonville Public Library from March 1 to April 9 with lots of small quilts and Quilt Show information.
- Quilt show was listed in the Upcoming Events page of the Arkansas Living Magazine
- 450 emails sent to regional area quilters with Quilt Show information
- Monies from Admissions increased from \$6,500 to \$7,400 (14% increase) from the 2015 to 2017 Quilt Show. We had 1,024 paid admissions.

Signage

The signage used in our Quilt Show is to direct and to inform everyone how to get to the show, what's happening at the show, new and old exhibits and other pieces of information. Each time, the information/signage fluctuates a bit and new signs replace old ones but many remain the same and can be used over again. However, this year we had the addition of two vertical fabric banners (9 feet x 30 inches) - you may have noticed them at the entrance to the show - and they were great at directing traffic to the venue. Done in colors of magenta, navy blue and yellow, these were designed by myself and done by FastSigns in Springdale. Put in place several days ahead of the show, they read "Quilt Show" with "Friday" and "Saturday" across the bottom to advertise the show a few days before hand. It worked out well!



2017 Quilter's R & R Retreat - NEW VENUE!

a note from liz ewing

The Retreat Center is on Highway 62 in Eastern Oklahoma.

We need a minimum of 24 ladies to sign up (by mid June) for the retreat to get the large sewing room free. So please register EARLY. The maximum will be 42. If we reach the maximum, you will be placed on a waiting list. It will be on a first come, first serve basis.

We will fill all rooms with three people except for the people who want a fourth person in their room. If we have rooms left over that are not occupied, then we will look at two to a room or one to a room. Each room has three beds and it's own bathroom. Linens, pillows and towels/washcloths provided.

If you do not already have roommates, we will be assigning people to the rooms. For \$20, you can come out and sew with us Saturday. This fee includes room use, lunch and retreat fee.

The sewing area is quite large and the retreat center provides long tables and chairs. You are welcome to bring your own table and chair. We plan to have several cutting stations and two ironing stations.

People wanting to do hand work are welcome. There are some very nice sofas with very good lighting that will be comfortable for doing hand work.

The center has a soft drink machine and an ice machine available. It has a small kitchenette with a refrigerator where you can put your drinks and medication. Snacks are welcome.

Because this retreat center is out in the "country" their electricity is a little more iffy so we are asking you to not bring your "big irons" for your sewing station but consider getting one of these for your personal sewing station. The Clover iron is 80 watts and the Steamfast is 200-400 watts. These are the lowest watt irons that I have found. Maybe you can ask for one of these small irons for Mother's Day or 4th of July, or birthday!!!!!!!!!!!!!! If you do not know what your iron wattage is, just look on the handle end of the iron. It lists voltage and wattage. Most of you already have these little irons but there might be some that did not know they were available. Check with your quilt shop.

We plan to have some classes/demo's, block drawings (one traditional and one modern), mystery quilt, and Fat Quarter Craps. Everything we do at retreat is optional except eating, sleeping and sewing!

The Front Porch Quilt Shop is in Stillwell, OK which is close by and worth a visit.

For all those that sign up, I will be communicating via email further information such as supply lists, retreat center policies, retreat schedule and Medical Form.

The building is available at 9 am on Friday Aug 25 however, you will have to provide your own lunch. The first meal will be Friday evening. We will be leaving Sunday at 3 pm. Breakfast is served at 8 am, lunch at 12 noon, and dinner at 5:30 pm. Sign up deadline is the first of August.
