Charlotte, Karen, and LaVonne made a motion to approve the Board Meeting Minutes as printed in the April Newsletter. All voted in favor.


April Speaker – Liz Granberg-Jerome

Thanks again and when we rest up we'll start planning for the 2021 show!!! Joe Ann Reaves


