April Guild Meeting

The meeting was called to order by David Moran.

Laura Speer reported we had 1000+ visitors at the recent show, and we took in from \$16-\$1800. The venue has been booked for the 2021 show.

They stay in the healing program up to 2 years, receiving the support and schooling that will enable them to find jobs and support their children again. We left 4 quilts for them. - The Children's Hospital has enough for the time being, but we will keep in touch with them.
