*A motion was made to approve the Treasury Report for September by Kathy Turner, and seconded by Adele. All voted in favor.

*A motion was made to approve the Board Meeting Minutes for October by Roberta Harris, seconded by Mattie. All voted in favor.

October Guest Speaker: Michelle Wilkie

Originally from New Zealand, Michelle has been a quilter since 2012. Her passion is to design a quilt, then turn it into reality.

Her first quilt won a prize at a design competition. The center was paper pieced. Back was also pieced.

- 2. 1st prize in 2015. The challenge was low volume versus high contrast. She did needleturned embroidery, and block matched the binding. Match stick quilting takes forever!
- First prize at the State Fair, this is needle turned embroidery. The design is based on manicured gardens in Germany from prints and solids.
- 4. Modern traditional. Her son was studying fractions, and had to make a drawing on a graph. He drew this square to illustrate





what he had learned. Then he wanted a quilt made of it. But the small one she made wasn't enough; he wanted a big one! She did straight line quilting in each block, but made the lines continue into the border on one triangle to break the "block" look.

5. Design for this quilt comes from wrought iron street lamps in Manheim, Germany. She got the triangle pattern from them. The back seems to be piano keys. She designed it to illustrate the negative image of a cross walk. Pieced back.

- 6. Abstract designs. Someone wanted alpine designs, so she made 3 pillow cases.
- 7. Designed from the tram stop in San Francisco. Named it San Francisco Bustle.
- 8. During her sixty-hour work week, she spent an hour or two per day after work just sewing. These blocks are improvisational design about her feelings. The black and



white show how she felt on Mother's Day after learning about her mother's cancer. The back is made with reversed colors.



9. Another improvisation design, hand pieced. Since it is so busy, the blue gives the eye a place to rest.

Michelle does a design in her journal once a week. She made the last design of the freshly painted lines on an interstate.

One was from an airplane wing. She sees a quilt in everything!

Document every quilt you make in a scrap book. Include for each project:

- Fabric swatches
- Inspiration, notes on the quilting, ideas
- What you were thinking of
- Did you enter it in shows?
- Who did you give it to?

Designing your own quilt requires thinking backwards. When you use your own designs, you know to add seam allowances to the pattern.

I change my needle when the machine begins skipping, and before I start quilting.

Once she had 3 weeks off after a procedure. She started looking around and saw quilt blocks. One became "Apple Tree & Dandelions."


Oh Yes! The Round Robin!
