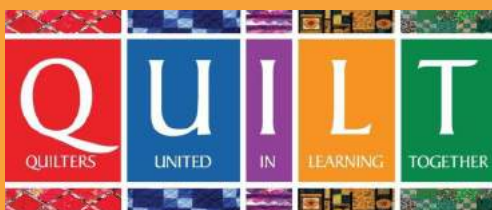

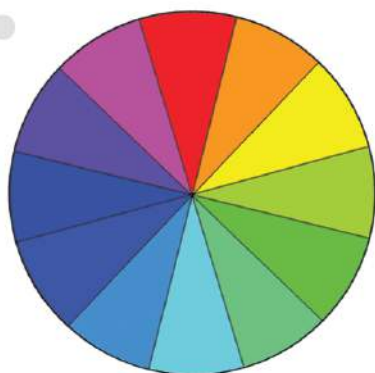

### Color Wheel Basics

### Color Wheel

Any color system can be organized in hue (color) order in the shape of a circle or wheel. Once organized in a color wheel, relationships and harmonies between colors become easy to see. A color wheel can be used to help you find coordinating fabric colors or inspire new combinations of colors for quilting and sewing projects.

### CMY

The initials of the partitive color system or printer's color wheel—Cyan, Magenta and Yellow. These are the three primary, parent, or stand-alone colors in the system which mix together to make all the other colors in the wheel.

### Cool colors

Colors around a color wheel can be divided into two halves; cool and warm colors. Blues, greens and violets are described as cool, calming colors that recede into the background. They are cool, crisp, soothing, and passive.

# GATHERING FLOWERS

TAUGHT BY KATHY KANSIER

This is a six-hour workshop and one you don't want to miss. Kathy Kansier designed this table runner so you can learn a variety of

techniques including making layered flowers with a variety of embroidery stitches and creating a scalloped inner border. Students will spend the majority of the day making and fusing the appliqué pieces and scalloped border to the background and learning a variety of hand embroidery stitches. Kathy will discuss finishing the edges of the shapes by machine with a simple blanket stitch and doing the decorative stitches by hand. She will also give directions for finishing the outer edges of the table runner after you complete the embroidery stitches. By the end of the class, you will go home with your shapes cut and fused to the background with some of the decorative stitches completed. This project can be finished within two weeks if you spend 3-4 hours each day working on the hand stitches.

This workshop location is to be determined and will be held on Saturday, January 26th from 9am to 4pm.

Cost will be \$40 for members, plus an additional \$80 for the required kit. Please contact Lori Jones at [allianceLori@aol.com](mailto:allianceLori@aol.com) if you would

Scissors with sharp point (for cutting applique shape)

Mechanical pencil

6"x24" acrylic ruler & 12" metal ruler

Silk pins (Clover suggested)

Applique pressing sheet (for ironing board)

Optional: table Ott light, chair pad

Cotton Thread to compliment fabric choices

Black wool background

Variety of wool plaids, textures & hand dyes

Perle cotton & chenille needles

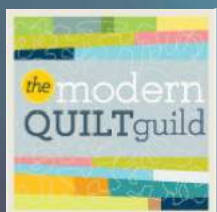
