A message from our President


Dear September Stitchers,

The Essence of Retreat by Cassie Robinson

Missouri Star Quilt Company Retreat. The first four words many of you may already be familiar with. I mean, who doesn't know of the charismatic Jenny Doan?? Certainly not many quilters. But when you put that last word to use, when you add 'Retreat' to the mix, that changes everything.

How do you sum up four days in what has been coined the Disneyland of Quilting?

Do you start with the shopping? Shops with bolts and bolts and bolts of beautiful fabrics; something for everyone to gaze at in wonderment and inevitably leave with yardage of some variety (or multiple varieties of yardage. Maybe even a sewing machine!).

Or do you start with the retreat center itself? Cozy rooms neatly aligning the upstairs hallway with quilts adorning the walls and a very spacious sewing space occupying the underneath.

Maybe you start with the town of Hamilton. Just a small town tucked into, what seems like, nowhere. A charming downtown with everything you need within walking distance; restaurants (shakes, even!), a grocery store, a small park, a bank, and of course, the aforementioned shopping.

Should you start with the quilting? After all, that is one of the reasons you have came, to tackle some (because you know you have too many to finish *all* of them in four days) of your projects. You unpack your machine, your cutters, your mat, your fabrics, your pattern. The whir of the sewing machine takes you on to a sense of accomplishment, to pride, to thinking of that person your project is for. Happiness finds you in these moments (seam ripping, or not). Soon, you share your project with others; we are all curious of what you are up to, and we share ours with you.

And then, suddenly, you realize where you should start. Missouri Star Quilt Company Retreat can certainly be described as somewhere you go to shop, stay in a retreat center, discover a small hometown & get some quilting done. But it is so much more than that. You have learned that, really, it is about relationships. It is about your quilting family. You learn of kids and grandkids, battles with cancer, you learn of interests outside of quilting (it happens!), where your friends come from and their experiences, of friendships and family. You laugh together, and if you decide to do the jelly roll race, you cry together. You congratulate each other, you eat together, you help each other, you adventure with Flat Jenny together. You cheer for each other, you stay up late together, you prepare meals together, you definitely shop together, and yep, you might even bunk together.

Through it all, good, bad, and indifferent, your *family* will be there. Drawn together by quilting, yes, but held together by so much more. *Retreat* has now become your glue, your quilt sandwich. In this moment, in this place, this is where your happiness becomes your joy.

Lori introduced tonight's speaker Paula Mariedaughter - Diagonal Designs make Dynamic Quilts.

To open the program, Paula Mariedaughter, Adele Atha, Therese Ramsey and Kathy Garringer all came in wearing 60's style clothing and danced their way to the front of the room to "We Are Family", as Paula stated in her opening remarks, we, the members of the guild, are all family.

Paula has been quilting for over 20 years, and has been fascinated by fabric since an early age. Her goal is to share ideas and help people to use their imagination when thinking of a quilt. Some of her types of quilts are whole cloth, blocks, and stripy to name just a few. She brought and shown many of her quilts, some vintage where she had redone them in her style; several had pictures in them and all her labels told a story of the blocks or quilts. When you make directional lines, break up the block gives it interest and makes it interesting. Paula finds fabrics in some very unusual places; she uses different things such as a shower curtain or clothing. She thinks that different fabrics make unique quilts. Another idea of hers is if you start a project and find out you hate it, use this as the backing for a quilt that you do like that way your backs are unique too. Add elements, think about backgrounds, get a feeling of dark and light, color gets the credit but value does the work. Put some diagonal feeling in each quilt; drag your diagonal into the border for more contrast too.

Paula's ideas of use of fabric, color, design, and techniques encourage all of us to think outside the normal quilt patterns and try something totally different and hopefully diagonal. Denim Chenille October 27th – Sujita Shah from India; Workshop – October 28th Crazy quilts (organized chaos)
