Super Saturday: August 24

Zipper pouches

Taught by Elizabeth Ray

: Requirements

- (2) 7.5"x10" fabrics for outside
- (2) 7.5"x10" fabrics for lining

Tip: you can piece together 4"x10" pieces of scraps.

- (2) 1"x2" fabrics for covering zipper tape ends.
- (1) 10-11" zipper (Elizabeth will sell white ones for \$0.50 each)
- (2) 7"x10" pieces batting, soft and stable, fleece, or interfacing. Different weights will give different dimensions or drapes. Elizabeth will bring cotton scraps to use or bring your own.

Optional: (1) 4"x2" fabric for hanging loop

Sewing machine with zipper foot or a narrow foot

Coordinating thread for top stitching and joining the liner

12" ruler, rotary cutter, mat

Crista came all the way from Las Vegas to help us feel comfortable and accomplished quilters on our domestic machines! Divide and conquer! Anchor across, starting at the edge, working to the middle. Use straight lines, wiggly lines, fancy stitches, whatever it takes! When you get to the middle, turn it around, and here you have already covered half of the quilt! After



you've conquered the quilt with 1 inch to ½ inch lines, you will have a beautifully finished quilt! Well, that's what I got out of it, and I certainly was impressed at the simplicity of it!

Dresden Quilt Challenge (2021 Show)

For this challenge, participants are asked to create unique quilts using and inspired by the traditional Dresden Plate block. Eligible quilts must feature dresdens full or partial as a primary design element. Dresdens may include but not be limited to: partial plates or blades, pieced, appliquéd, fabric printed with Dresdens, single Dresdens, multiple Dresdens, etc.

This is for Q.U.I.L.T. of NW Arkansas's challenge for 2021. The quilt must be at least 30 inches across by 30 inches in length. It can be a maximum of 40 inches across by 40 inches in length. It also must be by definition a quilt with 3 layers; top, batting, and backing. Any technique to make the top can be used to convey the topic of the quilt.



MACHINE QUILTING......PLAIN AND FANCY DAZZLING DOODLES ON THE DOMESTIC MACHINE


A machine quilting class for all levels
