When Judy Bowers retired from a Pediatric Nurse career in



Minnesota, she searched for something to do that would fill the gap that nursing no longer urgently required. Now she teaches quilting and quilt drafting and rides motorcycles! Dorene Speckman introduced her to machine work.



In order to become a certified Neimeyer Technique instructor, one must complete 5 projects in classes by certified teachers. The Compass Rose was her first Judy Niemeier project. Then "Fractured Paint box" with over 70 fabrics in it. You have a LOT to choose from when you have had a quilt store, and then closed it down!

There were leaf projects, and then she took classes directly from Judy at her

retreats. My project was the vintage compass. She learned to use the Purple Thang instead of a seam ripper.

She took "Fire Island Hosta" from a certified guilt teacher.

Judy's techniques of the month include

- "Glacier Star,"
- "Mariner's Compass,"
- "Paradise in Bloom."





- "Valley Wedding Star"
- "Prismatic Star" in purple
- "Feathered Star"

She did a series of quilts in different sizes. It's no simple tweak to change one of Judy's patterns from size to size.

The Flower table toppers went from 4 petals for dogwood, to 5 petals for impatiens, to African violets.

The placemats were:

- Broken Daisies & Dahlias,
- Scandinavian Snowflakes (Machine Applique),
- Rainbow Hosta,
- Harbor Lighthouse pattern (you fill in the squares of the design with your own patterns),





- Vintage Rose
- Inner Peace Dahlia which won best of class and best of show in the same show.


2020 Membership drive
