
Letter from the President:

Last night when I was coming home from the guild board meeting I noticed that it was twilight already – it was 7:50ish. So rest assured that Fall will come....just not this week.



The Fayetteville Senior Center served over 55,000 meals in 1918, including the MOW clients and folks who came into dine at the Sr. Center. 


